The Chico Chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union of Northern California (ACLU) would like to thank Sergeant Terry Baker of the Orland Police Department and Acting Sergeant Travis Goodwin of the Glenn County Sheriff's Department for their courage, professionalism and high moral standards as recently demonstrated at the POST Supervisor's Course at the Dublin Training Facility.

As reported in the June 18, 2008 edition of The Sacramento Valley Mirror, Sergeants Baker and Goodwin walked out of the meeting when they took exception to what they perceived was a "We protect our own" response to a hypothetical training scenario presented in the class.
